



## Birding Tour

This Tour is conducted within our property known as the Fresh Water creek area in the Stann Creek District. Between the months of December to March several flocks of birds migrate to the southern part of Belize. To feed on different type of fruits especially the famous colorful Scarlet Macaw Bird. Our national Bird the Keel Billed Toucan which has been the bird with the highest demand to be sighted can be seen right around our cabanas throughout the year.



The Stann Creek District is the smallest district, yet it has a good diversity of habitats and species. A total of 457 bird species have been reported from the district, including: Spotted Wood Quail; White winged Becard; Yellow-headed Parrot; Chestnut headed Oropendola; Scarlet Macaw; Crimson collared Tanager; Striped Owl; Green Honeycreeper;

American Oystercatcher; Barred Forest-Falcon; Black Skimmer; White Hawk.
